EXPANDING THE LEGAL ECOSYSTEM

OUR MISSION + PURPOSE

Families experiencing poverty are inadequately supported by our justice system, which is severely under-resourced and inherently complex. Nearly 9 out of 10 families do not get the legal help they need. These unaddressed legal issues act as barriers to health, economic, and housing stability. As a result, many people do not access existing legal protections and trust in the legal system is low.

Legal Link provides an innovative solution. Evidence shows that justice problems do not always require lawyers' assistance. In many instances, people need a trusted helper with knowledge of legal rules, procedures, and resources. With a mission to remove legal barriers that prolong poverty by adding critically needed capacity to the legal ecosystem, we partner with community-based agencies to support their direct service staff to act as legal navigators for the families they serve.

Our model relies on strong, collaborative community partnerships. By embedding legal navigation support in community-based settings, we are creating and supporting a new - yet sustainable -frontline of legal navigators who help to surface unmet legal needs, identify legal issues, and access legal protections.

The devastating impacts of COVID-19 have magnified and exacerbated legal needs across the country – including housing instability, food insecurity, and increased rates of domestic and intimate partner violence. With an anticipated tidal wave of evictions in the coming months (approximately 1.5 million eviction filings are projected in California alone), access to legal protections is more critical than ever. The pandemic has also amplified the urgent need to bring accurate, concise, and timely legal information directly to affected communities. Legal Link-trained navigators take significant personal risks and work tirelessly to continue to serve their clients in the face

of COVID-19. We recognize and strive to support the important role these navigators play in our legal ecosystem.

To date, we have provided 3,400+ legal consultations and trained 700+ navigators from more than 50 trusted community organizations throughout the Bay Area. Much work lies ahead, but we are heartened by all that our team and network of navigators have accomplished over the past year in the face of unprecedented challenges. PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

LEGAL FIRST AID TRAINING PROGRAM EXPANSION

We trained new partners in our signature Legal First Aid curriculum across the social services, health, and faith-based sectors, including the San Francisco Community Clinic Consortium, the Fremont Family Resource Center, and the Interfaith Movement for Human Integrity.

COMMUNITY NAVIGATOR FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM LAUNCH

In the fall of 2020, we launched our inaugural class of Community Navigator Fellows. Our one-year Fellowship trains and supports frontline staff at partner organizations to become fluent in community-based legal navigation, and includes in-depth training, skill-building, and one-on-one case review with Legal Link attorneys.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

This year, the pandemic inflamed the inequities embedded in our justice system and brought the value of trusted, community-based helpers into sharper focus. Our mission continues to guide our work, and we remain focused on bringing key legal updates and information directly to frontline providers in a timely, trustworthy, and usable way to ensure that families impacted by COVID-19 receive the help they need.

While the pandemic has forced us to change how we deliver services, it has also created new opportunities to maximize our impact. To this end, we translated our training curriculum to a virtual setting, added an introductory training to expand the reach of our online tools, created COVID-specific resources, and increased the frequency of our newsletters to highlight key steps navigators can take to support their clients.

COVID-19 NAVIGATOR RESOURCES:

We created and curated various COVID-19 resources. We also rebranded our monthly newsletter, the Navigator, and published it with more frequency, with a focus on clarifying the rapidly changing legal landscape. In total, we distributed 19 newsletters in 2020 containing key, actionable tools and resources for our navigator network to use with their clients.





LEGAL NAVIGATION 101:

Based on partner demand, we developed a new one-hour training that introduces community partners to the concept of legal navigation, presents an overview of basic legal system concepts, and familiarizes them with Legal Link's online tools and resources.
