As a result, low-income individuals and families receive adequate legal help just 8% of the time. Housing Navigator	1. Teach basic legal system concepts and an overview of housing legal issues faced by clients.
Training cover?	 Provide a methodology and tools for navigators to use when confronted with legal housing issues.
	 Offer practice opportunities through interactive housing specific exercises and active engagement with our online tools.
	4. Trained navigators will have access to post-training support from Legal Link attorneys.
	5. Navigators with clients who are San Francisco residents will be able to directly sign-up clients for free 30-minute legal-consultations with a Justice & Diversity Center attorney on a weekly basis (limited and full scope representation available).
What can Housing Navigators Do?	Housing Navigators will have added knowledge, ability, and confidence to: identify key housing legal issues that clients face, connect clients to relevant legal resources, and referrals, and deliver targeted navigator housing support. We clarify the line between lawyer and non-lawyer work, and encourage participants to embrace the valuable role they can play as community-based navigators.
Program Length + Location	The 2-hour Housing Navigator Trainings are offered virtually via Zoom. Sign-up on Legal Link's website to register and receive meeting details.
